

Phaedra S. Corso is an Associate Professor of Health Policy at the University of Georgia's (UGA) College of Public Health. Her research focuses on the economic evaluation of public health interventions, with an emphasis on the measurement of quality of life in underrepresented populations. Prior to joining the faculty at UGA, Dr. Corso worked for 15 years at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) in the areas of health economics and injury and violence prevention. She has published numerous articles on the cost-effectiveness of prevention interventions and has co-edited a book on economic evaluation and decision analysis methods for use in public health. She holds a Master's degree in public policy from The University of Georgia and a Ph.D. in health policy, decision sciences, from Harvard University.
